## OutWord *For Family Discussion*

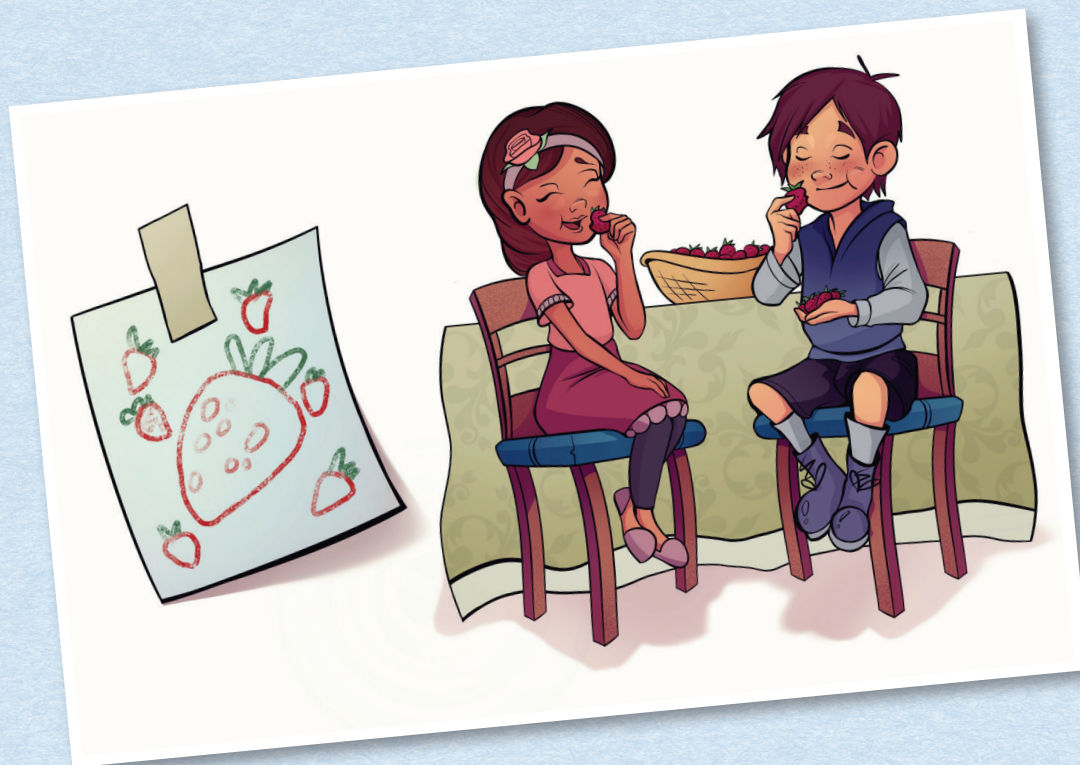
Some people claim that the Old Testament isn't worth reading. **What would you say to them?**
