



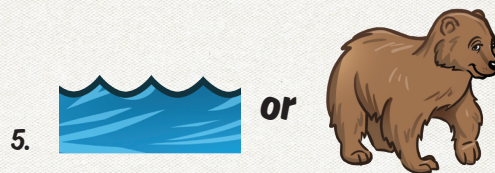

OutWord *For Family Discussion*

What if your friend asked you, “Why would God need to rest on the seventh day? I thought God could do anything—it doesn’t make sense that He needed a rest already!” **What would you say?**

You are right! God didn’t need to rest—but we do need a day of rest—and God knew that! He was introducing our seven-day week. He worked six days, and He rested on the seventh day so we would learn to do the same.
